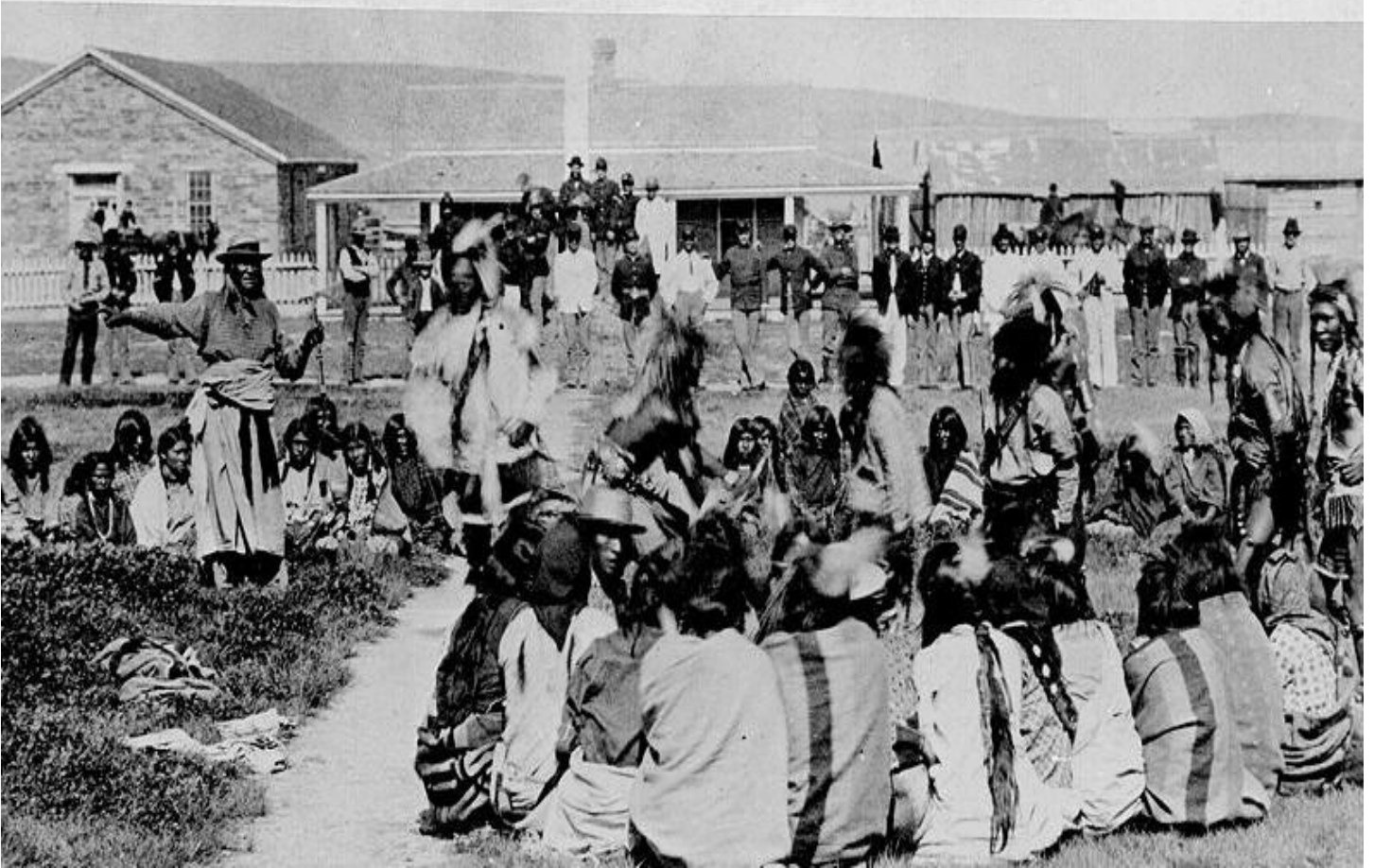


# A Short Story About Sacagawea



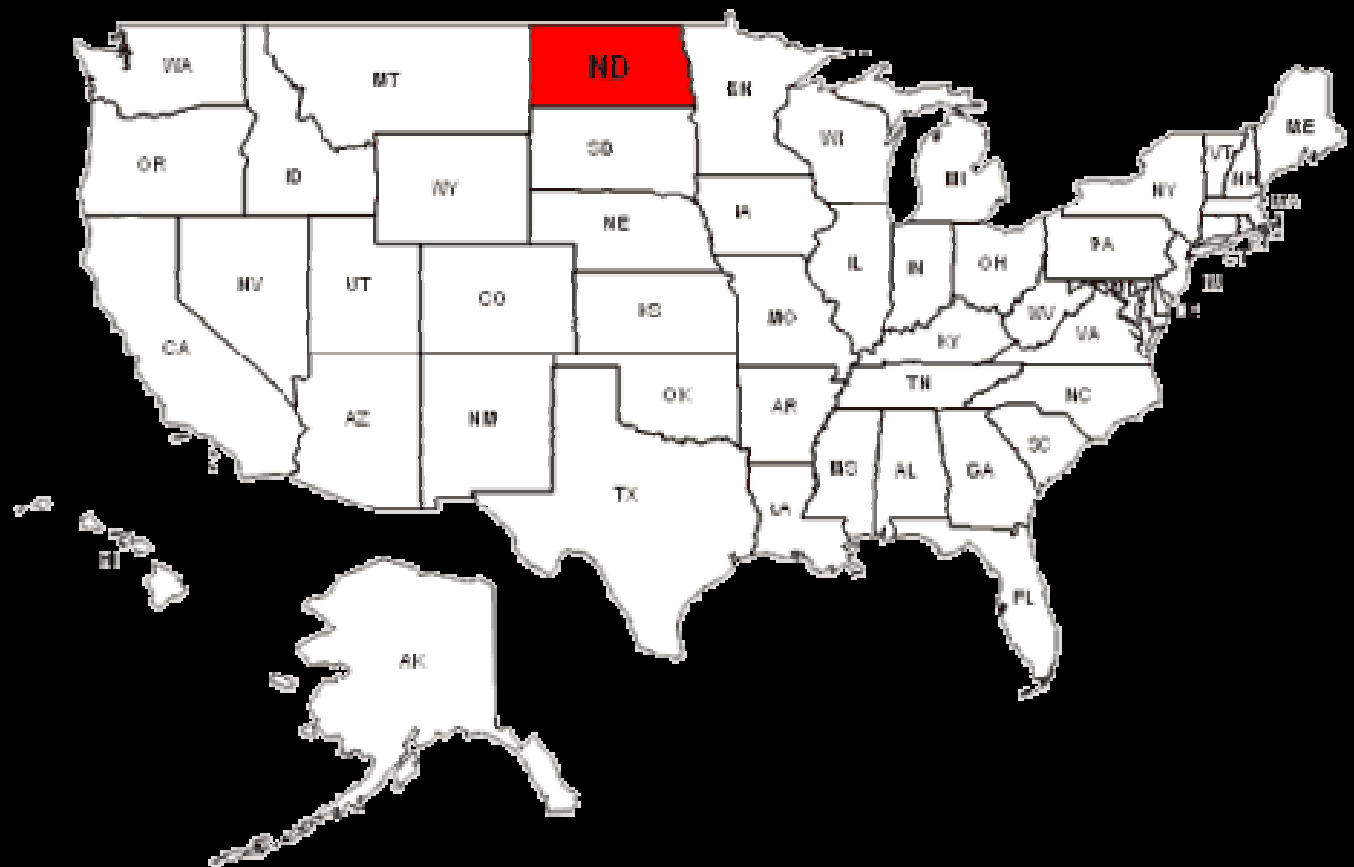
- Sacagawea was a member of the Shoshone tribe. She lived in a small village in Idaho.

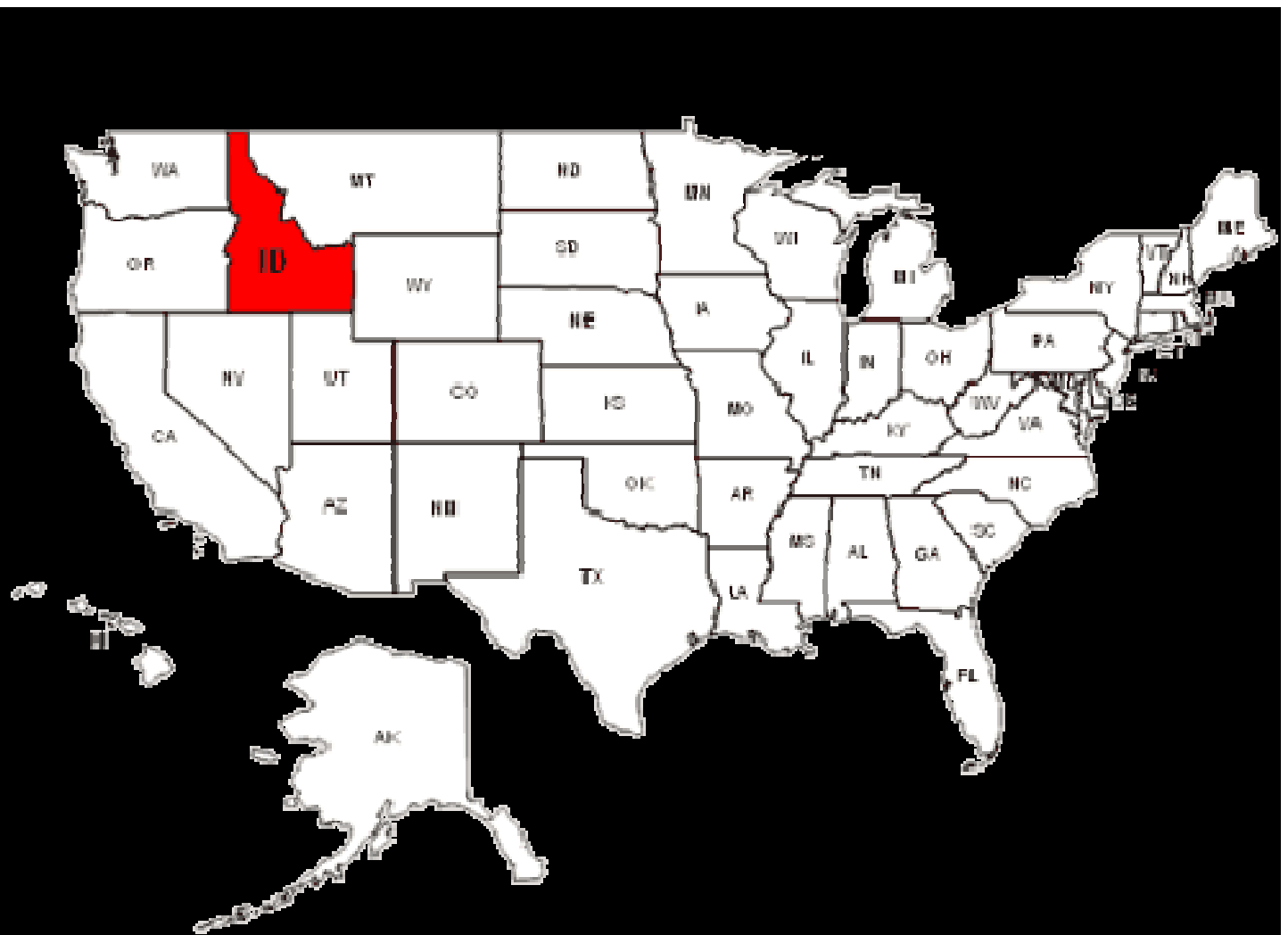




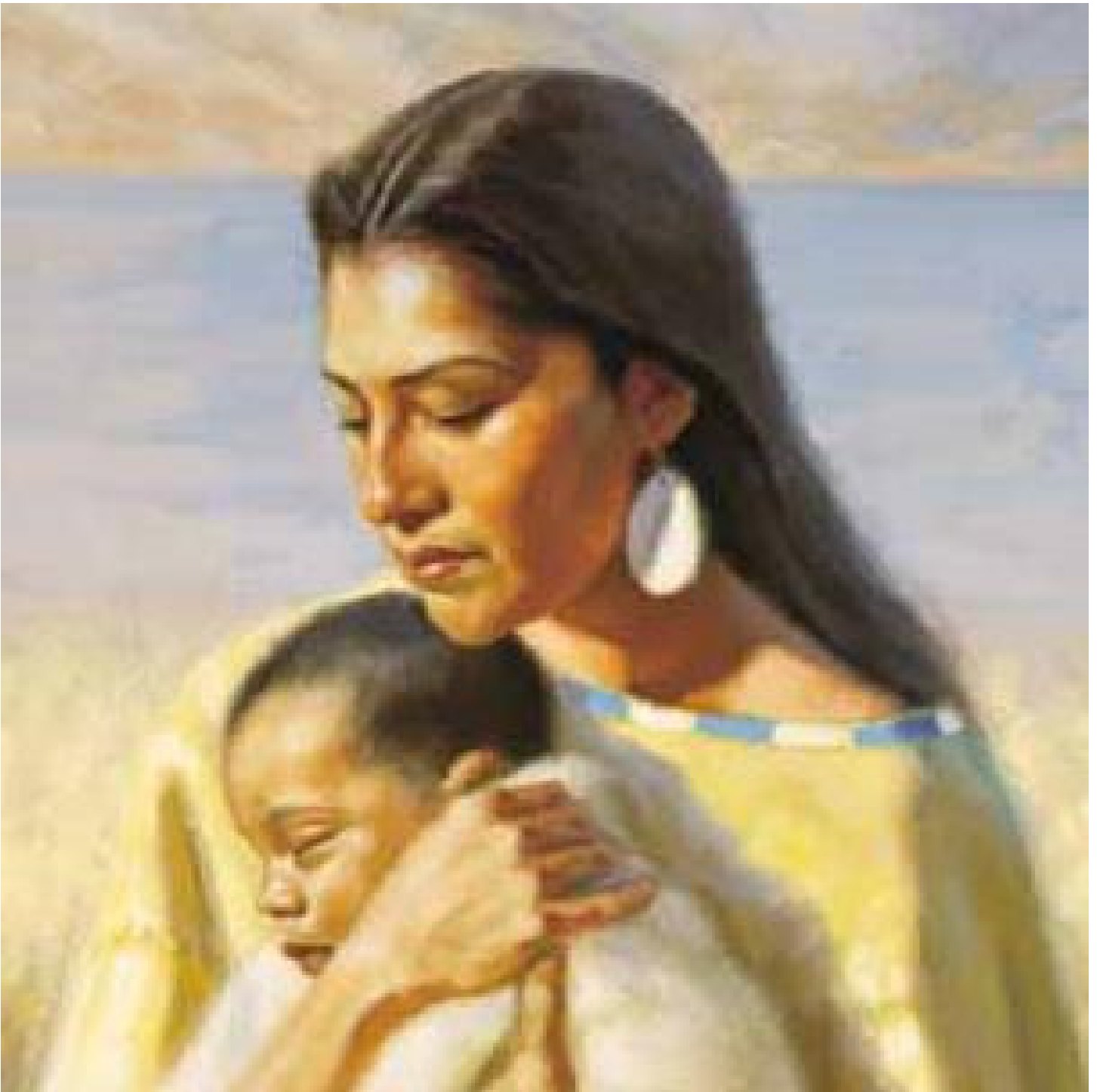
- Sacagawea was captured by a tribe called Minnetarees when she was 11 years old.
